Maxwell Bourke's daughter - Mackenzie

Meet Mackenzie Bourke, the daughter of a proud father, Max Bourke, General Manager of Rail Terminals and the first female to hold an unexpected position in Major League Baseball.

What began as the Adelaide Giants' clubhouse manager and travelling secretary led to a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity in US professional baseball as the team's travel and clubhouse manager with the Jersey Shore Blue Claws. The Blue Claws are the Philadelphia Phillies' 'High-A' minor league affiliate. They are no strangers to the Adelaide Giants, as many of the club's players have played on the team.



Like any other dream, achieving it requires a brave first step. Mackenzie took this step by emailing the Adelaide Giants with the words "I will help- with anything. I was hoping there may be a role I could assist with to further develop my knowledge and experience within professional sporting organisations. Within the next few years, my goal is to move to America to work within the College sports (athletic) departments or for a professional sporting organisation. Therefore, this is why I believe experience with the Giants would give me valuable experience." This would be her first leap of faith, which got her in the door, and she began living her dream in the Australian summer of 2022.

After a season of volunteering with the Adelaide Giants, she was able to resign from her full-time job to focus on her passion. She says that many people thought that she was crazy, but she was confident that it was worth the risk. In her interview with Eric Balnar for the Giants website, she shares, "I was at the ballpark every day, doing anything and everything I could to prove that I was capable to work within Professional Baseball. No task was too big or too small; I was willing to give anything a crack. Hard work and dedication are the two words that come to mind when I think about why I earned this opportunity."

The opportunity in question is the next step she took with the support of Giants leadership and players, particularly coach Chris Adamson and General Manager Nathan Davison, who forwarded her the advertised position on Linkedln.

She counts herself lucky to get an interview, the first of many that would include a range of people from the Phillies and the Blue Claws. No doubt her spirit, accomplishments, and references from the various people from the Giants saw her through the lengthy process and resulted in her getting the position.

She goes into this new journey with the goal of doing everything she can to support the players and staff to the best of her abilities off the field so that they can focus on delivering on the field. She believes that preparation makes a season easier because it's like setting yourself up for success. This is more so important because she is making history as the first female Clubbie in MLB history, something she doesn't take lightly as it places her in the position of being a role model for many young girls who want to be in the professional baseball industry. It is a great opportunity for her to demonstrate that one can achieve anything you set your mind to.

Mackenzie says that, ultimately, her dream is to work full-time in baseball in both Australia and America, "chasing summers," as her mum often says.

The sky's the limit for this 22-year-old young lady, who will be representing Australia and is often called "The best in the business" by the Giants' players.
