



Freight and Trade Alliance event

Freight & Trade Alliance (FTA) and the Australian Peak Shippers Association (APSA) are Australia's leading voices for international freight forwarders and exporters. They partnered with SCT Logistics on the 11th of December 2024 to host a morning networking breakfast and site tour event. The event was hosted by Matt Eryurek, GM Ports, and David Nash, Victorian State Manager, and was supported by broader team members from sales, operations, and rail. It was held at SCT's Victoria facility with over 100 attendees from the industry.

The event provided a platform to showcase SCT's capabilities in delivering freight via their network, featured an operational demonstration of cross-docking from an international container filled with cartons into a domestic container, highlighted development land opportunities, and demonstrated rail, maintenance, and operational facilities to international freight forwarders in Melbourne with a national interest.

Sal Malici (FTA) said, "In a period of increasing vertical integration, where stevedores are moving to acquire national container transport capabilities, it is crucial for this industry to recognise these shifts and consider forward-thinking strategies. As the landscape evolves, industry players are encouraged to assess options that enhance flexibility and maintain competitive reach. Partnering with SCT will enable International Freight Forwarders to do so."

David Nash – SCT Victorian State Manager, a long-term port logistics key figure in Australia said, "Every day 24/7 this industry helps fill ships in and out of Australia. This industry is based on customer service, sales, and the ability to coordinate freight needs from origin to destination. We have trucks, locomotives, rail rolling stock and cross dock facilities in all major cities and we rarely compete with international freight forwarders. In fact, we are complimentary to them and their clients."

Matt Eryurek our GM Ports Development said, "SCT is a unique company where we can create opportunities for major international shipping lines to build warehouses at one of our 7 key locations around Australia linking them to ports and the national rail network. Alternatively, we can enable these forwarders to land containers into our operations without double handling, in turn distributing this freight by rail or road throughout Australia. 

As we crossed our fingers for Chris, he and the team returned victorious. Here is what he shared about his experience.



"We went into the tournament feeling pretty confident knowing our skills and plans would get the job done. But we knew it wasn't going to be easy. We expected New Zealand and South Africa were going to be strong and there would be tough games against them."

The team arrived 3 days before the tournament with only 2 days to train and acclimatise to the weather with an opening ceremony to kick off the tournament the day before their first game.

"We played 9 games in which we finished with 7 wins and 2 losses and finished in 2nd spot on the ladder. We lost to New Zealand in the first final and played Sri Lanka in the Sudden death final. The game against Sri Lanka had a festival feeling with drums and trumpets playing the whole game, which was great entertainment for all. We played New Zealand again in the Grand Final. The final was one of the best games I have ever played in. it came down to the last ball where we came away victorious and beating New Zealand by 1 run and becoming World Champions!!!"

The team were presented their medals and trophy at a spectacular closing ceremony after which all the countries joined in celebration. In the true gentleman spirit of the game, the players from the various countries became friends on and off the court.

"The achievement for myself and my family was amazing. To facetime them straight after the game to celebrate with them was a great feeling. They were sitting on the edge of their seats the whole game. The experience of going to play for Australia, seeing such a beautiful country and playing in such difficult conditions is something I will never forget. To have 13 other people to share this with and now have a special bond for years to come. The next tournament is in India in 3 year's time. So hopefully it will be the same squad to go and defend the title."






